
LISTENING TO GOD

Letting The Distractions Pass By

The quiet repetition of a single word can help us descend with the mind into the hearta word or sentence can help us to concentrate, to move to the centre, to create an inner stillness and thus to listen to the voice of God. When we simply try to sit silently and wait for God to speak to us, we find ourselves bombarded with endless conflicting thoughts and ideas. But when we use a very simple sentence such as 'O God, come to my assistance,' or 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on me,' or a word such as 'Lord' or 'Jesus', it is easier to let the many distractions pass by ... Make room for everything which is capable of rejoicing, enlarging or calming your heart, in a childlike spirit; but seek nothing restlessly. What is taken from you, just let go. God Himself you will keep for ever; or rather He will keep you. Nothing is more beautiful than simply to make room for God-without the aid of forms. In outward and inward detachment from such things, let yourself be permeated by God and His love. When we are quiet children of suffering, and extinguish all the power of anger in ourselves and in others with pure love, then Jesus comes in and sups with us. May the Lord bring all that is ours to a profound silence. *Gerhart Tersteegen*

Humbling Ourselves
